



In this activity report, we intend to provide more visibility and a voice to our collaborators and the young artists, scientists, sportspeople, entrepreneurs and students we support.



We have always collaborated with excellent research centres in Spain, supported the careers of young researchers and sought new ways of connecting with the beneficiaries of this research. Fotciencia, the science photography competition that has reached its 20th anniversary this year, has been the spearhead of our informative formats. On the occasion of another anniversary, five years of our research awards, we are adding the first workshop on food and health. Through this workshop we connect with associations of doctors, nurses and nutritionists, as well as with associations interested in the vegan diet.

Feeding health with research

In 2023, the Jesús Serra Research Awards reached its 5th anniversary. Once again, the winners presented pioneering research on food, nutrition and health.

At University of Navarra, Maira Bes-Rastrollo is studying what a healthy vegan diet is. In Barcelona, Manuel Irimia, ICREA researcher at the Centre for Genomic Regulation, is researching the molecular mechanisms that regulate insulin secretion.

Understanding the risks in order to take care of our heart

80% of cardiovascular accidents can be prevented. This is why four hospitals and 42 health centres in the Autonomous Community of Madrid are working together on the CardioRed project to improve cardiovascular care for more than 1 million people. By supporting the PreveCardio study, we are joining forces not only to reduce risk factors such as smoking and high blood pressure, but also to address prevention with equality in mind, through a campaign led by health centres.

In sports, like in life, we are all unique. And what defines us is our tenacity and professionalism. This is why, the Fundación Occident Cup - Spanish Para Alpine Ski Cup includes sportspeople with and without disabilities in a same competition, raising awareness on the relevance of sport in the normalisation of disabilities, whether they are physical, intellectual or sensory. In 2023, twenty skiers with functional and neuronal diversity participated, that is, 56% of the affiliated athletes with disabilities.


